We have come to enjoy your creative culture, to marvel at your unique historical heritage and to learn how you make science and technology serve the quest for further progress.

To be inspired by Mexico has always for me been a great privilege, and it is thus with humility and gratitude in my soul that I thank you for your warm welcome. In the coming days we will, I hope, witness how the strength of our friendship can lay the foundations of productive cooperation in the years to come.
