

A Message from the President of Iceland Ólafur Ragnar Grímsson

Stamp collections from the Nordic countries bear witness to the kinship between our nations, our history and culture; they commemorate important events and prominent people and stand as an ode to our natural heritage and the life of our societies.

These collections show us how the self-image of people in the Nordic countries has evolved in the course of time, reflecting the changing times through which we have lived.
